

MASTER OFFICIAL TIMELINE OF EVENTS

Website Edition – Updated Through May 12, 2026

Purpose of this Document

This timeline organizes known program activity, communications, documentation concerns, leadership statements, and participant observations into a chronological historical record.

Summary of Current Status

Topic	Current Observed Status
Documentation	No member-specific contracts, custody records, or individualized accounting records have been produced.
Authority	The last known LPOA expired on June 30, 2016. No updated authority documents have been produced.
Custody	Conflicting statements regarding asset custody continue without independently verifiable documentation.
Program Structure	Structured systems and future processes continue to be referenced without supporting documentation.
Transparency	Concerns continue regarding governance, communication control, and access to information.

Program Formation & Intake Phase (2015–2016)

August 2015

- Program activity and participant intake begin. Participants submit currency and/or funds under representations regarding structure, security, and anticipated future outcomes.

September 2015

- Additional currency submissions occur through shipping and delivery channels, including Zimbabwe currency (ZIM). Delivery acknowledgments are reportedly provided without formal custody documentation.

2015–2016

- Communications reference organizations including the Pay It Forward Foundation and Greater Good Foundation within broader organizational and humanitarian messaging.
- Participant assets are described as being pooled or aggregated into larger group or whale positions for exchange purposes. No individualized allocation or custody accounting records are provided.
- Participants provide tax forms, banking information, government identification, and ownership certifications. No fully executed governing agreement or verified custody documentation is produced.

January 2016

- A Limited Power of Attorney (LPOA) is issued granting authority related to currency transfer and exchange activity.

April 2016

- Participants are instructed to execute a new LPOA.
- Communications reference continuation of program activity despite no confirmed transaction completion, payout activity, or institutional involvement.

June 30, 2016

- The known LPOA authority period expires.
- No documentation has been produced showing transaction completion, asset return, extension of authority, or replacement governing agreements.

Continuation & Expansion Phase (2016–2022)

2016–2022

- Communications continue describing structured systems, managed processes, and anticipated future financial activity.
- No completed exchange, payout, or return process is independently documented during this period.

2019

- Participants are requested to re-submit Client Information Sheets (CIS) and updated identity information.
- No updated governing agreements or transaction status documentation accompany these requests.

2022

- Program activity continues through GIG website registration and vetting processes.
- Participants reportedly undergo qualification and participation procedures without supporting governance documentation.
- Members are informed that limited updates may be made for specific situations, including death or name changes.
- No formal documentation governing these updates is provided.

Online Infrastructure & Governance Phase (2022–2025)

2023

- Participants begin requesting contracts, custody verification, accounting records, and ownership confirmations.
- No complete or independently verifiable documentation is produced in response.

2024

- Statements indicate that contracts associated with Mark Meersman are null and void while references to prior paperwork continue.
- No replacement agreements or updated governing documents are produced.
- Members are directed to migrate from GIG-related systems to the 3FLI platform.
- Online membership systems, communication structures, and platform-based participation become more prominent.

2025

- Questions increasingly arise regarding governance structure, participation requirements, authority, transparency, and information access.
- Communications increasingly reference financial systems, processing structures, paymasters, and future transaction-related concepts without independently verifiable operational documentation.
- Concerns emerge regarding communication control, discussion management, and restriction or removal of certain participant-shared information.

Transparency & Documentation Concern Phase (2026)**2026**

- Conflicting statements continue regarding custody and control of various currencies and participant assets.
- No independently verifiable chain-of-custody documentation is produced.

April–May 2026

- Communications continue referencing program activity, financial systems, future processes, and anticipated outcomes without individualized verification, accounting records, or defined completion mechanisms.

May 2026

- Participants increasingly organize independent documentation efforts, informational archives, historical timelines, and transparency-focused resource materials.

May 12, 2026

- No active contracts, updated authority documents, verified custody records, individualized accounting statements, or independently verifiable completion mechanisms have been produced.

Current Status (May 12, 2026)

The program continues to be described as structured and active; however, independently verifiable documentation regarding authority, custody, accounting, and completion processes has not been produced to participants.
